OVER 525 YEARS OF MISTREATMENT, DOCTRINE OF DISCOVERY IN 1493, STOLEN LAND, RELOCATION, Introduction to alcohol, Rights to govern traditionally with communities forbidden, British North AMERICA ACT, COLONIZATION, INUIT RELOCATION, IMPOSITION OF INDIAN ACT, BANNED FROM CELEBRATING CULTURES AND TRADITIONS, THE SIXTIES SCOOP, SMALL POX, DISEASE FROM TAKING RESOURCES FOR TRADITIONAL FOOD, BEATEN, RAPED CREATING "STATUS" AND TAKING "STATUS" FROM OTHERS - DECIDING IDENTITY, RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS, LAST RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL IN B.C. 
SYSTEMATIC EQUITY
